

Eric Hoskins was a three year letterman in football, basketball and baseball while at Winnetonka. He was a three year MVP in basketball and voted First Team All Conference, All-Northland, All-Metro, All-State for three consecutive years in basketball and football. His senior year, his Jersey (#11) was retired.

After college he pursued his dreams by signing his first professional football contract for the New York Giants. He later played for two other National Football League teams, the Miami Dolphins and the Kansas City Chiefs, the Toronto Argonauts in the Canadian Football League, the Albany Firebirds and the Arizona Rattlers of the Arena Football League and in the European Professional Football League.

After playing professional football for eight years, Hoskins pursued his second dream, law enforcement as a deputy chief for the Kansas City, Missouri Police Dept. Hoskins currently serves as an undercover detective with the Gang Unit.

Hoskins is the owner of a professional minor league football team, the Midwest Titans, in the North American Football League, of which he is the Offensive Coordinator and a player.
